Emotional Resilience Nurse

The EHRT work with children, young people and families who may require low-level short-term support with newly emerging emotional health issues. They provide a range of strategies and interventions to support children and young people to manage their emotions.

Youth Practitioner

The Youth Practitioners work with young people both one to one and in groups delivering positive activities that develop self-esteem, confidence and resilience, supporting them to develop healthy relationships and build life skills.

Forest School

Forest School works with our transitional students in Years 7 and 8 and offers a way to capitalise on the therapeutic benefits of the forest/ outdoor environment.

Forest School develops confidence and self-esteem, Emotional Regulation, resilience and motivation through hands on experiences in a natural setting, such as bushcraft, woodland crafts, archery and games to meet the social and emotional needs of each child.






As part of the light waves topic 8x1 performed an eye dissection of a lamb's eye. The whole class were amazing throughout, following instructions perfectly.

- County Durham at the English Schools National Cross Country Finals in Sussex last weekend. Both girls will once again represent the North East (inc Tees Valley) at the London Mini Marathon on 26th April, (a British Championship race) and were both selected for the North East team at the Intercounties Cross Country in Nottingham. The girls, so far, have been selected for three national competitions in mid distance / cross country. An amazing achievement.
- Year 8 Ellie who recently took part in the Scottish Athletics Championships. Ellie performed brilliantly and achieved gold in the girls U15 60m hurdles with a new personal best of 9.42s.
- We welcomed players from Sunderland AFC women in school to deliver a workshop to our KS3 football teams. Players discussed their Football careers with our students and led a superb training session for the girls!
- Our year 8/9 girls football team won both of their matches this month, beating North Durham Academy 8-0, St Leonard's 4-0 and most recently St Robert's 2-0, with goals from Evie and Chloe. Poppy who showed great sportsmanship in the game by volunteering to play for the other team to make up numbers.
- The girls' football team also competed in a 6-a-side tournament, going on to win the tournament overall!
- Our Year 7 girls took part in the 'Biggest EVER Football Session' led by Durham & Chester-le-Street School Sport Partnership in their PE lessons. This project has been created to promote female participation in football.
- The Year 7 football team took part in a recent tournament and won two games and drew one. They demonstrated great teamwork and resilience in some challenging games!
- We unveiled our new Under 16 Girls' Hermitage Academy football strip. Thank you to Howlett Boarding Kennels & Instaclean Solutions Limited for helping to inspire girls to play football.
- Well done to our U15 Girls' handball team who showed great teamwork when playing their first competitive handball match. The girls won one of the two games and showed superb resilience throughout.
- A group of our students attended a county dodgeball competition this month. They narrowly missed the 3rd spot but won the Sportsmanship Award, meaning they were respectful of the rules and towards the other students, staff and competition hosts.
- The boys' and girls' athletics teams competed in the county finals with the girls finishing second by a very narrow margin and the boys finishing third overall. Eve broke the county record for shot putt and Jessica broke the county record for vertical jump!
- Our year 10 girls were involved in a Cricket Leadership Course with Durham Cricket Foundation. The girls will go on to leading a Cricket festival to different primary schools. This is a great opportunity to do some valuable work in the community.
