# New Year, Fresh Start! 🍡


Welcome to January's edition of Hermitage Herald – As we move into a new calendar year, here's a round-up of everything that's been happening in our school over the past month – enjoy!

Mrs Hodgson-Whittle and the English department will be inviting staff and students to celebrate **Reading Rocks**, where a week of activities and events based around reading is planned for the week after February half-term. 




#### Culture Vultures – Love edition
