Day to day tasks

Day to day tasks for a flying paramedic are:

- respond to emergency calls.
- assess situations when you arrive and check details with others at the scene, like the police.
- work calmly and quickly to stabilise patients.
- use a defibrillator to revive patients.
- give patients medicines and injections.
- attend emergency calls and decide whether patients need to go to hospital.
- check equipment regularly and keep accurate records.
- reassure family and members of the public who are on the scene.



Qualifications

Qualification requirements for entry to university courses vary (GCSEs, A levels or equivalent). A full, manual driving licence (with appropriate classifications) is required. Paramedics working in the NHS must be registered with the Health Professions Council.


