# The Twelve Days of Christmas

The Autumn term is always the longest, and possibly one of the busiest terms in the academic year. As we approach December, we embrace the spirit of Christmas and enjoy a variety of festivities. This year was no exception, with even more activities and events than last year.

- Hot chocolate was on the breaktime snack menu, and the whole school enjoyed their Christmas lunch on the 17th December, with a choice of a traditional Christmas dinner, or a festive sandwich for those who preferred a lighter lunch. Crackers were pulled and hats were worn – it was a lovely end to the term!
- We had a festive themed 'Ready Steady Cook' an inter-house baking competition, with Ambition victorious!
- The students also designed Christmas cards and wrote letters to residents of the local care home. Our Voices Group, led by Mrs McMullen, recorded a series of songs and carols for the residents, after a flu and covid outbreak meant that the children could not attend in person.

























- Other activities included a Christmas movie night, where 'Elf' was the chosen film, and of course, our famous 'Design a Christmas Door' – a fiercely competitive day of making a Christmas themed door from recycled materials.
- The Sixth Form continued their tireless charity work, and after a bake sale in school, there was enough raised to provide an afternoon tea at the local care home and also to buy toys and gifts to donate to the Cash for Kids charity. We also delivered102.4kg (128 meals) of food donations to our local foodbank.
- Year 7 enjoyed a local walk on the last day of term, from school to St Mary's and St Cuthbert's Church, to attend a special service. The hour-long service told of the Christmas story, with some carols and activities mixed in.

On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> December, students from Year 7 to 13 took part in a Musical Theatre showcase called 'A Night of Stage and Screen.' 
