## Lego Masters at Hermitage

An amazing job from our budding Computer Scientists.

A team of 9 KS3 students competed in the First Lego League tournament. The team had to code their robot 'Sub-Zero', to complete a range of difficult challenges in a 3-round qualifier. The competition then saw the team deliver the innovation project they have been working on over the last few months to a panel of judges, with a complex solution around how marine biologists can begin to remove microplastics from our oceans. They then competed in a straight knock out tournament with other schools from the Northeast where they got through to the semi-final round.

Over the course of the day everyone displayed the key core values the competition: Discovery, Inclusion, Innovation, Teamwork, Impact and Fun. The judges where so impressed in all areas, that the team were awarded the 'Nissan Award'.



The team's motto was highlighted by the judges upon receiving their trophy and sums up the team's philosophy.



#### Hermitage Sports Round-up

 Last month we hosted a regional U13 handball tournament. We had two teams representing our school, and both showed incredible growth and resilience. They faced every challenge head on, stayed positive and never gave up – a real show of teamwork and resilience.



- Well done to our Year 9 girls who competed in the county cup futsal final tournament. Well done for all of your efforts throughout each stage of the tournament.
- Our Year 8 Netball team competed in the Under 13s Durham Area and District Netball Tournament. The team had a successful afternoon winning 4 out of 7 games and scoring an impressive 29 goals.
- Well done to Year 8 Ellie who recently took part in the Northern Athletics Championships. Ellie finished in 6th position and qualified for both the hurdles final and the Nationals competition!
- Ellie also competed in the England Athletics Nationals this month. She came 2nd in her heat and 5th in the semifinal, setting a new personal best of 9.65. She is now ranked 18th in the UK for Under 15s and 3rd for Under 14s. A phenomenal achievement.
